Number of individuals in Torrance County custody: 56 (50 male, 6 female)

Number of ICE detainees: 139

Notes: On Saturday, May 14, 2022, ICE transferred 28 detainees to TCDF On Monday, May 16, 2022, ICE transferred 17 detainees to TCDF

As of May 15, there were 122 detained noncitizens in ICE custody at TCDF. On that day, the breakdown of the detainee population by nationality was as follows:

STAFFING

Current staffing level: 63% (based on the current ICE contract to hold 505 detainees). Currently, 57% are cleared to work with ICE detainees.

According to ICE, with the current staffing level, the facility can accommodate 300 detained noncitizens.

Current number of employees on staff: 130 full-time employees (117 of whom are assigned to work with ICE detainees).

Number of employees on staff that are on temporary duty assignment (TDY): In addition to the 130 fulltime employees, TCDF also currently employees 13 people from other facilities.

Current number of vacant positions: 75
