

Summary and Analysis of the Buffalo Tract Protection Act

Summary of the Buffalo Tract Protection Act:

This bill will withdraw 4,288 acres of BLM land, including an eponymous tract shaped like a buffalo, from all forms of mineral development, while maintaining the authority of BLM to sell, lease, or exchange the surface rights.

Permanent withdrawal would...

- 1. Protect a wildlife corridor and the surrounding habitat and
- 2. Support the role of local communities as they shape the actions of federal agencies.

Subsection Analysis

- Sec. 2(a) withdraws the land in question from all forms of mineral development.
- Sec. 2(b) defines the land as four plots of land totaling 4,288 acres near Placitas, NM.
- Sec. 2(c) maintains the authority of BLM to sell, lease, or exchange the surface rights to the parcels, and ensures that if rights are sold, leased, or exchanged, the mineral rights will remain withdrawn from development.
