
I am requesting funding for APINH Center – New Mexico in Fiscal Year 2027. The entity to receive funding for this project is City of Albuquerque located at PO Box 1293-1, Civic Plaza NW, Albuquerque, NM 87103. The funding would be used for to establish a physical hub, known as the APINH Center, that would serve the cultural, social, and economic needs of APINH New Mexicans through culturally responsive programming and multifunctional spaces.

The project is an appropriate use of taxpayer funds because investment in public facilities, youth services, and community infrastructure as key priorities to strengthen neighborhoods and support low- and moderate-income residents.

The project has a federal nexus because the funding provided is for purposes authorized by Title I of the Housing and Community Development Act of 1974 (42 U.S.C. § 5301 et seq.), which supports community development activities to develop viable communities by providing decent housing, a suitable living environment, and expanded economic opportunities, principally for low- and moderate-income persons. Eligible uses include the acquisition, construction, and improvement of public facilities and community centers, as well as activities that support workforce development, economic opportunity, and community services.
